What is contract driver training

- Licence acquisition training delivered to the MoD
 - Intensive
 - Time critical
 - Results rewarded
- The MoD conduct the majority of their specialised driver training in house.
- Basic Licence Acquisition Training is primarily contracted out to six training organisations, AcciDON'T being one of the largest.
- In turn these companies recruit individual ADI and NRI registered instructors to deliver intensive training as required.
 - Some are employed (mainly LGV instructors)
 - ADIs tend to be self-employed.

How it works

- Students

- Students are normally trained two at a time
 - In most cases this works well
 - Sometimes 1:1 is more appropriate
- The training day is 8 hours with time off for lunch and breaks
- Training is on consecutive days
 - Greatly reduced skill fade between sessions
 - Fantastic motivation as tests are within days, not months
- Each student is required to receive 3½ hours of hands on, driving seat training per day
- When not driving they should be alert, watching and included in the lesson
 - There can be a great deal of benefit from watching others

How it works

- Testing

- Testing
 - Tests are requested through the primary contractor.
- Tests are normally conducted from where you pick up your students
- Tests are conducted either by military personnel or by Defence Driving Examiners
- Tests are normally provided within 48 hours of a request, with retests also being available promptly.

Who & where !

- Locations are from Inverness in Scotland, Helston in Cornwall, Folkestone in Kent, Northern Ireland and most places in between.
- Students are normally 17-24 and will have passed the Theory Test
